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SCIENCE

We will be focusing on rocks and soils, looking at how rocks are formed and how different types of rocks are used. We will carry out scientific investigations and learn how to make observations and conclusions.

FRENCH

We will be introducing the children to simple words and phrases from everyday life.

COMPUTING

We will learn how to research through the Internet and use word processing skills. We will also learn about how to be safe when using the Internet.

ART

We will learn how to use a variety of mixed media to create artwork linked to our topic. We will also develop our drawing skills through observation and imagination.

This term we will be focusing on settling in at a new school and exploring our feelings about the many changes that happen during our lives.

DESIGN TECHNOLOGY

We will be investigating pivots, levers and slides to create our own moving pictures.

R.E

As part of Hampshire's curriculum for schools, we will be learning about Good and Evil within the context of Diwali.

HISTORY

We will be learning about Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age in Britain and visit Butser Farm to find out more. We will be comparing these 3 eras of our history and learning about how people lived during these times.

GEOGRAPHY

Our focus will be on the Northern and Southern Hemispheres and the Equator. We will also look at the continents and oceans.



MUSIC

In our music lessons we will be focusing on changing dynamics in a piece of music to create different effects. We will then look at the effect of layering instruments to create interesting compositions.

P.E

In P.E. we will be working with a professional hockey coach to learn the skills involved with the sport. In games we will be developing striking and fielding skills such as catching, throwing, striking with a variety of bats and working cooperatively.
